Mae married **Ernest William Wilkowski**, son of **Louis Ernest Wilkowski** and **Sophia Etscheid**, on Jun 2, 1915 in Fond du Lac, Fond du Lac County, WI. Ernest was born on Aug 15, 1889 in Reeseville, Dodge County, WI, died on Mar 20, 1956 in Paris, France at age 66, and was buried in Calvary Cemetery, Fond du Lac, WI. The cause of his death was heart attack and pneumonia. They had two children: **Ernest William "Ernie"** and **Jean Mary**.

Marriage Notes: Ernest is first mentioned in the 1900 census. He lived at 512 Hancock St with his parents and siblings. He graduated from grade school on June 24, 1903 in Watertown, WI. His father died a week later and Ernest went to work as a hotel clerk at the Commercial Hotel. The 1908 Watertown Directory lists Ernest as chief clerk at that hotel. He still lived at home with his mother, brother and sister at 512 Hancock St. In 1910, Ernest had moved to Fond du Lac to work at the Palmer House. He rented a room at 57 S Main St. It is interesting that most of the other lodgers also worked at the hotel.

Mae was born and raised in Fond du Lac, WI into a large Irish Catholic Family. She was the tenth and youngest child. She appears on the census for the first time in 1900. The family lived at 85 Doty St in Fond du Lac. By 1910, Mae's father had died and the family sold the house on Doty St and moved to 75 W Johnson St. Mae worked as a stenographer at the electric company.

Ernest and Mae met at The Palmer House. She was the public stenographer and he was the assistant manager.. They married in 1915 and in 1916, they moved to Rhinelander, where Ernest took over management of the newly constructed Oneida Hotel.

I can't find Ernest in the 1930 or 1940 census, although he should be indexed in Miami according to his daughter. I have a postcard dated 1954 from Miami where he was working at the time. In 1954, they lived at 1438 Alton Rd in Miami Beach. Ernest was working at the Richter Hotel After retirement, Ernest and Mae lived in Florida and spent time with their children in Germany and Paris, France, where he died.

After Ernest died, Mae lived in Miami FI, Wisconsin, and also visited her daughter at Jean's many diplomatic posts. She died in Rome, Italy.

Lt Col Ernie Wilkowski (Ret), 74, a resident of this area for more than a quarter of a century and close-out commander at Glasgow Air Force Base, died at Oregon Health Sciences University Hospital In Portland, Ore, May 11, following a long illness.

A son of Ernest and Mae Wilkowski, he was born Dec 24, 1917, in Fond du Lac, Wis. He married Helen Ahlborg, Sept 1, !945.

He first entered military service in 1935 in the Naval Reserve. He enlisted in the army in 1941 and was accepted into the Army Air Corps in January of 1942. He was stationed at Glasgow Air Force Base in 1964 as deputy base commander for supply and was named close-out officer in 1968. He retired from military service July 31, 1969, and remained in the Glasgow area until the time of his death.

During his military career, he earned the Air Medal with 12 oak leaf clusters, Distinguished Unit Citation with one oak leaf cluster, Distinguished Flying Cross, Meritorious Service Medal, Good Conduct Medal, American Campaign with Foreign Service, European/African Middle Eastern Campaign with assault landing, World War II Victory Medal, Army of Occupation Medal/Germany, National Defense Service Medal with bronze star, Overseas Unit Award/Long Tour with bronze oak leaf cluster, and French Croix de Guerre with Palm.

F. William Dugan once said there was not "anything more competitive in the world than newspaper advertising."

In a career spanning 47 years at The Plain Dealer, culminating with his leadership as vice president and general manager of the newspaper, Mr. Dugan thrived on that competition and was a financial backbone of the company.

Mr. Dugan, 91, died Saturday at Normandy Manor of Rocky River, where he had lived more than a year. "I remember him as a fierce newspaper advertising competitor who believed that exceptional service to readers and advertisers was the most effective way of growing circulation and advertising revenue," said

Plain Dealer President and Publisher Alex Machaskee. "He was a man of deep commitment to his faith." Mr. Dugan joined The Plain Dealer in 1927, working part time as a classified advertising salesman while attending John Carroll University. Two years later, he began working full time at the newspaper.

In 1934, he moved to the retail display advertising department as a salesman, handling financial advertising and later handling accounts of retail apparel and men's shoe stores. He was promoted to retail advertising manager in 1951.

In 1960, he became advertising director and later assistant business manager.

Mr. Dugan was promoted to general manager in June 1961. The title of vice president was given to him the following year.

Thomas Vail, former publisher and editor, president and chairman of The Plain Dealer, called Mr. Dugan an intensely loyal and devoted leader at the newspaper. "He was very conservative in his views and single-minded," Vail said. "He was really a straight arrow. He wouldn't stand for anything that wasn't good for The Plain Dealer. But, he had a great sense of humor, too."

Vail credited Mr. Dugan with his own appointment as publisher and chief executive of the newspaper in 1962. He said Mr. Dugan nominated him to the board of directors although it meant Mr. Dugan would work for a person who was about 20 years younger than himself.

Mr. Dugan was born in Oshkosh, Wis. His father, an accountant, moved the family to Cleveland when he was in the third grade. He later graduated from St. Ignatius High School.

He served in the Army Corps of Engineers during World War II, entering as a private in 1943. He was in three European campaigns, serving in France and Belgium. Later, he was transferred to Okinawa. He left the service as a sergeant in 1945.

Mr. Dugan served as past commander of The Plain Dealer Post of the American Legion.

He was a trustee and member of the executive committee of Catholic Charities Corp., beginning in 1962. He served as campaign vice chairman in 1970. He also served as district chairman of the appeal's special gifts division and led the annual fund campaign for two years.

He was a member of St. Christopher Catholic Church for more than 50 years and attended daily Mass for many years. He was a member and past president of the Serra Club, a Catholic laymen's organization to further vocations to the priesthood.

Civic minded, Mr. Dugan served as a trustee of John Carroll University and of the Greater Cleveland Hospital Association. He was a member of the Cleveland Advertising Club, the Cleveland Chamber of Commerce and the Westwood Country Club.

He had been a resident of Rocky River for more than half a century.

Surviving are his wife of 63 years, the former Angela Hahn; and a grandson, Michael.

A son, John G., is deceased.
